# Keith Call Waters

POCATELLO — Keith Call Waters, 78, passed away Thursday June 6, 2002, at Bannock Regional Medical Center. He was born December 6, 1923, to Clarke A. and Stella Call Waters in Rigby, Idaho.

He grew up and graduated in Pocatello. He served in the Merchant Marines from 1943 to 1945. On August 27, 1946, he married Leta E. Reece. Keith worked for Waters Refrigeration for 42 years as a contractor. In his spare time he loved to hunt and fish.

He is survived by his children Kent Waters, and Sandra (Mike) Jensen both of Pocatello, his brother Darrel Waters of Pocatello, 3 sisters Donna (Carl) Williams of Burley, Kathleen (LaVern) Simon of Mt. 

Spencer was up to no good. I'm glad he is out of his misery. Laura & I did what we thought Mom would want, a burial place for him. He is right next to

I got the label from it & noted it ran till May of 1995 & was \$49.00. I wrote as if Spencer wrote & said to cancel and send the refund.

A week later, another one came.  
I haven't ~~opened~~ opened it but I'm going  
to write to someone, Senator or  
Representative & complain about that  
stuff being sent ~~through~~ through the mail.  
Laura found pictures in his personal  
things that arrived at her house  
& looked like a picture of Spence  
& a prostitute. I wonder if he  
died of Aids. He died of pneumonia  
& Aids people usually finally die  
of pneumonia. No wonder he  
didn't want his family to know  
where he was. He was as low as  
a man can get, I think. The
